Teachers Report

1. **Introduction** – Ms. Jenn and Ms. Emily introduced themselves and shared a little about their background and experience.

2. Talk about a typical day

 Ms. Jenn talked a bit about the first weeks of school andRoutine - doors open, names, backpacks and come to carpet which covers the calendar or changes to the routine, chooses the helping hand, down for gym/outside to play songs and games which are coordinated with the theme for the month, come back up, eat snack (encourage healthy snack – small discussion around this) back to carpet for any group activity, centres or craft, back to carpet for goodbye song, backpacks and dismissal

3. Outline the guidelines for snacks

As discussed above, healthy snacks please as much as possible, no juice boxes – water bottles

4. Skating

October to March – not mandatory. Do not have to be in skates, they may come in boots but are
required to wear a proper winter sports helmet. Parent's are required to accompany their child.
Siblings are allowed as well but must be strapped in stroller or if on the ice with a winter sports
helmet. Volunteers for that day are not credited for the skating but only for the hour and half
afterwards. Those who do not wish to participate in skating may come to class when skating is
done.

5. Importance of volunteers – thank you.



- First couple weeks as the kids are getting used to their new routine there will be no in class volunteers. Monthly calendar will be posted and you may sign up for which day you would like.
- In class- Help with things such as reading, preparing for snack, bathroom breaks/washing hands, cleaning up after snack and craft, craft set up. We ask you are there to help all the kids and not just yours, no cell phones, no pictures as some parents have not signed consent form for release. No siblings
- Out of class toy cleaning and classroom cleaning
 Checklist will be provided wiping down tables and chairs, cleaning the floors steaming and
 vaccuming, sweeping out treehouse and wiping all surfaces, wiping down the bathroom.
 Toys- Bleach water and plain water solutions and cycle through toys that can be washed, left to
 dry. Those that can not be washed will need to be wiped down with disinfectant wipes. Not
 everything will need to be cleaned, toys are transitioned, those that are needing to be washed
 will be left out by the teachers.

Mandatory Cleaning Shift – maximum three hours to clean, if you are paired with another family one will do toys and one can do classroom

Volunteer positions

1. General
